The Teasdale Family of Hants County, Nova Scotia

John and Barbara Teasdale came to Hants County Nova Scotia from Penrith, Cumberland England in 1818. Two of their sons, Joseph and John, had families who stayed in the Hants County area for a few generations, migrating to Halifax and to Antigonish, while Robert, another son, moved to Massachusetts. This genealogical report details their families.

I am not a descendant of this family but they overlap with several families in Hants County that I do descend from – McDougall, Fraser and McPhee.


Joseph Teasdale -

Among the pious dead, of whom honourable mention may be made, is Mr. Joseph Teasdale, of Indian

Road, Hants Co., an uncle of Rev. J.J. Teasdale, who departed this life on March 2nd, aged 75 years. Mr. Teasdale's native place was Penrith, Cumberland Co., England. In 1819 when 7 years of age he came with his parents to Windsor, N.S., where the family resided a number of years. He afterwards settled at Indian Road, in which place he remained until removed to the better world. About 38 years ago he was converted and joined the Methodist Church under the ministry of the late Rev. Wm. McCarty, the genuineness of which change he continued to show by a good walk and conversation, ever manifesting an interest in the welfare of the cause of the Lord. His last affliction was painful, but patience had her perfect work. In an interview with him a few days before his death he spoke of his abiding confidence in God's goodness, and manifested calm submission to His will. He leaves a widow, five sons and three daughters to mourn their loss. On the day of his burial a large number assembled evincing their respect for the departed – and we thought his life and death warranted the text by way of improving the occasion, "Mark the perfect man, and behold the upright; for the end of that man is peace."

An Archival Mystery

Intrigue in the Archives! The other day I was going through some records when I noticed a reference to a sermon book of a Rev. John James Teasdale. We have lots of sermons here at the Archives so that's nothing out of the ordinary but what caught my eye was a note about a possible bullet hole through the book of sermons. When I pulled out the book, sure enough, there was a rather suspicious looking hole in the book. I'm not an expert on guns or bullet holes by any means but after doing some "thorough research" (i.e. walking down the hall to talk to my co-workers), it seems likely that a bullet was what caused the hole. Don't take my word for it though, you can see and decide for yourself if you scroll down the page.

Rev. Teasdale was born in Windsor, Nova Scotia in 1839. He was ordained as a Methodist minister in 1862 and served in various Maritime churches including Yarmouth which is where these sermons were preached. Teasdale would later become president of the Nova Scotia Conference. He passed away on May 31, 1910 in Ontario. The Maritime Conference Archives acquired 10 books of his sermons from Dalhousie University who had in turn purchased the books from an antiques dealer in Smith's Cove, Nova Scotia. It's hard to say when the book was damaged, the sermons were dated 1891 so at least we know Rev. Teasdale was alive long after that date. I'm hoping that it was just someone doing some target practice and that no one was actually injured. In any case, it certainly makes for a mystery...

Isaac and Christopher Teasdale must have been visiting since they are listed on the 1881 Canadian Census for Hants County. Duncan and Isaac Teasdale must have emigrated sometime during 1881, because they show up in 1881 on the Westborough Valuation List on Page 74 as paying Poll Tax.

On 22 Dec 1871 when William John was 25, he first married **Jessie Fraser**, daughter of **William Fraser** (10 Jul 1810-30 Aug 1851) & **Mary "Ann" Clow** (ca 1804-15 Mar 1864), in Westborough, MA. Born on 13 Dec 1844 in Nova Scotia. Jessie died in Westborough, MA, on 5 Jul 1901; she was 56.

* Walter George Mitchell, KC (May 30, 1877 - April 3, 1935) was a Canadian lawyer and politician. Born in Danby, Quebec, the son of William Mitchell, a Canadian senator, and Dora Godard, Mitchell was educated at the Montreal High School, Bishop's College, and McGill University where he received a Bachelor of Civil Law degree in 1901 and was a charter member of The Kappa Alpha Society. After being called to the Quebec Bar in 1901, he practiced law with the law firm of Greenshields, Greenshields & Heneker. He soon was part of the firm Laflamme, Mitchell and Callaghan and was created a King's Counsel in 1912. He was acclaimed to the Legislative Assembly of Quebec for the electoral district of Richmond in a 1914 by-election called after the death of Peter Samuel George Mackenzie. A Liberal, he was re-elected by acclamation in 1916 and in 1919. He was Treasurer of the Province of Quebec from 1914 to 1921 in the cabinet of Lomer Gouin and Louis-Alexandre Taschereau. From 1918 to 1921, he was Minister of Municipal Affairs. He resigned in 1921 and was elected to the Canadian House of Commons for the electoral district of St. Antoine. A Liberal, he resigned in May 1924. He ran again in the 1930 election for the electoral district of Richmond-Wolfe but was defeated.
