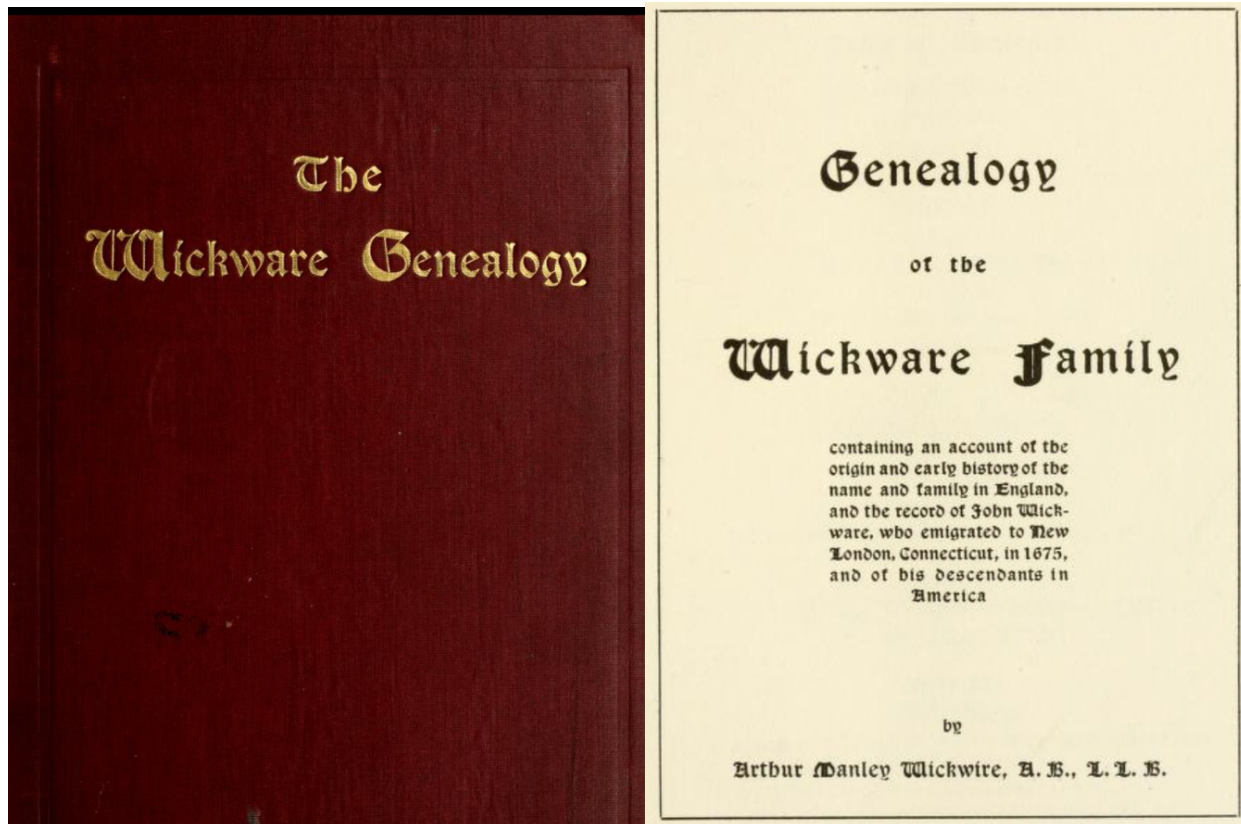

Preface

The Wickwire Family held special interest to me because my father was born and raised in Milford Station, Hants Co., NS, and Wickwire's were amongst the first settlers to that village, in fact it was first named as "Wickwires" before the name was changed to Milford Station.

A very complete genealogy of the family, including early English history, can be found in the book below.

There are two founding families of Wickwire's in Nova Scotia- John¹, Christopher², Zebediah³, Dyer⁴ is the branch that came to Wolfville from New London, Connecticut and Dyer's son David⁵ moved to Milford Station. The other branch is John¹, Peter², Peter³, Silas⁴, who moved from New London to Cornwallis in 1760.

In Chapter 1 (starting on Page 4, Index p. 20), I have copied the two branches directly from the book, for four generations. I kept the Register numbers from the original work when copied directly into all three chapters, so names can easily be referred back to the source. Then to keep the two family groups together, I separated each family into Chapter Two (starting from Dyer⁴, Page 22, Index p. 58) and Three (starting from Silas⁴, Page 66, Index p. 87). I reviewed all of the Nova Scotia Historical Vital Statistics data and Nova Scotia census data (1871-1921) for inclusion in Chapter 2 and 3.

Chapter 1: The England and New England Roots

First Generation

1. John Wickwire. Born in Wotton-under-Edge, Gloucestershire, England. John died in New London, CT in 1712.

JOHN Wickware, the ancestor of the American family of Wick-Ware and Wickwire, settled at New London, Connecticut, in 1675. He is supposed to have been the son of John and Mary Wickware, of Wotton-Under-Edge, England, baptized 18 May, 1656.

He was a soldier in King Philip's War, and was engaged in the Great Swamp Fight, December 19, 1675, when the powder of the Narragansetts was broken. For his service in this war he afterwards received from the General Court a grant of 140 acres of land in Voluntown. (Bodge, *Soldiers of King Philip's War*, pp. 442, 445.)

He settled in the North Parish of New London, (now known as Montville). His name appears on the list of residents of New London in 1676.

On Nov. 6, 1676, he married Mary Tonge, daughter of George¹ and Margery Tonge.

¹ George Tonge was an early settler at New London, and in 1656 the general town meeting chose him to keep an inn for five years. In those times only trustworthy citizens were accorded this privilege. In the same year he purchased a house and lot on the Thames river, "and here he opened the house of entertainment which he kept during his life, and which, being continued by his family, was the most noted inn of the town for 60 years."

George Tonge and Margery his wife had three daughters, namely: Elizabeth, born Oct. 20, 1652, who married Gov. Fitz John Winthrop; Hannah, born July 20, 1654, who married Joshua Baker (see *Bakers History of Montville*, pp. 153 to 175); and Mary, born Sept. 17, 1656, who married John Wickware.

On December 14, 1663, a tract of 200 acres of land in the North Parish was granted by the proprietors of New London to George Tonge (3 New London Deeds, 14, 15; see appendix D). He received also other grants. He died about 1670.'

On May 7, 1670, Margery Tonge, as administratrix, transferred to Joshua Baker, her son-in-law, a dwelling house originally acquired of Thomas Stanton, (vol. 5, p. 34).

Richard Poole, an early settler at New London, received a grant of 100 acres in the North Parish, adjoining the 200 acres of George Tonge, and dying in 1662 left it by his will, dated April 25, 1662, to Margery Tonge and her children.

John Wickware was one of the 77 patentees of New London, named in the patent granted by Gov. Winthrop, Oct. 14, 1704.

By deed dated June 30, 1708, he and Mary his wife granted to Rene Grignon the tract of land in Voluntown received for his service in the Indian War.

At the time of his death he owned several tracts of land besides the homestead, and his estate was appraised at over 300 pounds — a considerable sum for those times. He died in March or April, 1712, as appears by Hempstead's Diary. By his will he named his wife Mary Wickware, James Harris, Jr., and Col. John Livingston as his executors. He left his entire estate to his wife "during her natural life and at her death then the said estate is to go to my children."

Following is a copy of his will:

"In the name of God amen. The seventh day of February, 1711/12, I, John Wickwire of the County of New London in the Colony of Connecticut.

I futturi being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God therefore, calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to dye do make and ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say, principally and first of all, I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian burial, at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, devise and dispose of the same in the

George Tonge had also acquired a tract of 40 acres in the North Parish, originally granted to Thomas Stafford.

On July 20, 1689, the estate not having been divided, Margery Tonge granted to Joshua Baker full leave to go upon and use the farm, including her interest in the Poole tract. (5-131)

On Mar. 11, 1690, Margery Tonge, "in consideration of great love and affection to my loving grandchild, George Wickware, the son of John Wickware and Mary his wife, my daughter," granted one-half of all her right in "the farm that was on the land of Richard Poole." (5-140)

On Sept. 17, 1692, commissioners appointed by the court to divide the estate of George Tonge executed an instrument apportioning a part of it as follows: "That hundred acres of Poole's, the middle part for Elizabeth Tonge, that end next the Coave to Hannah Baker, and the west end to Mary Wickware ; that which was Thomas Stafford's the middle part to Elizabeth, the souther- most part to Mary Wickware next her own, and the northermost part to Hannah Baker ; and the two hundred acres originally George Tonge's, the easternmost part of it to Hannah Baker, the middle to Elizabeth Tonge, and the western end to Mary Wickware ; * * * the other estate we have not yet settled." (5-149)

On Aug. 14, 1694, Elizabeth transferred to Joshua Baker all her interest in the Stafford and Poole tracts, and in return appears to have acquired Hannah's interest in the tavern property. (5-197) Caulkins states (p. 289-90) that Madam Winthrop inherited the inn.

As stated above, Elizabeth Tonge married Fitz John Winthrop, Governor of Connecticut from 1698 till his death in 1707. They had only one child, Mary, who married Col. John Livingston, one of the executors of John Wickware's will. After the death of Gov. Winthrop, in 1707, Elizabeth resided at the inn. She died April 25, 1731. Her will, dated Dec. 2, 1730, makes several specific bequests, and contains the following residuary clause: "Item. My will is that the residue of my estate not before disposed of be divided according to the discretion of my executors between the two daughters of sister Wickware."

following manner and form, imprimis. I give and bequeath to Mary Wickwere, my dearly beloved wife, whom I likewise constitute, make and ordain my Executrix of this my last will and testament.

Item. I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Mary Wickwere all my Real and personal Estate after my funerall charg and all my just debts air paid, during her natural life and at her deth then the said Estate is to go to my children but my said wife is to dispose of the estate to my above sd children as she sees cause. And I John Wickwere do constitute, make and apoint Col. John Livingston and Mr. James Harris, Junor, Boath of New London my Executors with my wife Mary Wickwere and (revoke) every other former Testaments wills legacies and bequests and executors by me in any before named will willed and bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written.

John Wickwere (SEAL)

Signed Sealed and delivered by the sd John Wickware as his last will and testament in the presence of us the subscribers.

Samuel Young and Benjamin Star, witnesses to the above instrument appeared in a Court of Probate held in New London June 16, 1712, and made Oath that they saw John Wickwire the Testator signe and seal the sd Instrument, and heard him declare the same to be his last will and Testament and that they together with William Swaddle subscribed thereto as witnesses, and the said Wickwire was then of a sound and disposing minde and memory according to the best of their understanding.

Mrs. Mary Wickwire widow and Relict of Mr. John Wickwire, late of New London, deceased, appeared in a Court of Probate held in New London, June the 16th 1712, and made Solemn Oath that shee gave in unto the aprizers a true account of the Estate of her deceased husband Mr. John Wickwire according to

the best of her knowledge and if any thing further appear to be his Estate, that is considerable, it shall be added to this Inventory.

Test. George Denison, Cler."

Some inferences may be drawn from this inventory. The bible suggests the religious spirit of that age. The "7 books" indicate that John Wickware was an educated man, and in view of the scarcity of books, and the fact that the first printing press in Connecticut was set up in 1709, it is not strange that he did not possess more books. The flint-lock gun, bayonet, "catoos box," ammunition and rapier, are graphic reminders of the Indian War in which he bore his part, and of the dangers which beset the lives of the primitive pilgrims. The use of the word "Mr." before his name, in the clerk's certificate, indicates his social position, as in those days that title was applied only to men of social rank. Pursuant to the testator's wish, expressed in the will, Mary Wickware made various conveyances to her children of portions of the estate.

He and his wife were bapt. at N. L. June 25, 1710. He joined the church at New London, Oct. 8, 1738. In 1748 Jonas Hamilton was described in a petition to the General Court at a member of the church in the parish of New Salem. In 1746, he signed his name as a witness to the will of his brother-in-law, Christopher Wickware. The Probate Journals describe him as of Colchester in 1747. The births of his children are all recorded at New London.

VII. Ann, b. Sept. 25, 1697; m. Oct. 14, 1714, James Brown of Colchester, who was probably son of James and Remembrance (Brooks) Brown of Colchester. The banns were published Sunday, Sept. 5, 1714. Perhaps they had other children than those named below. She was baptized, together with her daughter Ann, by Rev. James Hillhouse, on Oct. 28 1722.

On 6 Nov 1676 John married **Mary Tonge**, daughter of **George Tonge** (11 Nov 1617-4 May 1674) & **Margery Poole** (1 Dec 1630-1 Dec 1713). Born on 17 Sep 1656 in New London, CT. Mary died in New London, CT, on 6 Apr 1728; she was 71.

2. Christopher Wickwire (*John¹*). Born on 8 Jan 1679 in New London, CT. Christopher died in New London, CT, in 1747; he was 67.

Second Generation. 2 CHRISTOPHER* (John¹), b. Jan. 8, 1679-80; married Elizabeth, resided at the North Parish of New London, now known as Montville; and later removed to Lyme. On Sept. 21, 1724, he and his children Ichabod, Solomon, Nathan, Elizabeth, Ann and Mary, were baptized by Rev. James Hillhouse, pastor of the Second Congregational Church, at the North Parish. His son James was baptized by the same clergyman on Oct. 23, 1726, and his son Zebediah on Mar. 22, 1729-30.

On Jan. 16, 1716-17. he conveyed to Lt. Col. John Livingston a tract of land at New London for 118;^ . The deed was acknowledged at Norwich. One of the points described in the deed is "a cellar that John Wickwere built." On June 25, 1731, he transferred to John Viber certain land at the North Parish. One of the calls in the deed is "a place where John Wickwire built a cellar.' The testimonium clause reads as follows: "In witness whereof the said Christopher Wickwerr and Elizabeth his wife in token that she resigns all her right of thirds in the granted premises have hereunto set their hands and seals the 16th day of January 1716-17 in the third year of the reign of King George the Second." On Sept. 26, 1733, he transferred to John Rogers, Jr., for 12;^ a one- third part of a whole right in the common "which was allowed by the proprietors of New London unto my Hon'd. Father Mr. John Wickwere, deceased." On Sept. 27, 1734, he conveyed to "Johnathan Wickwere of Norwich," for 30;^, 32 acres of land on Pole's Hill, lately belonging to Mrs. Livingston, and bounded on the home as laid out "unto the heirs of my Hon'd. Father John Wickwire, formerly of New London, deed., on account of his division in the outside Common and inside on Gray Commons, as the same is entered in the Proprietors Book Sept. 27, 1733." In these deeds he is described as "of New London." It appears that he did not remove to Lyme till after 1734. On June 5, 1739 Christopher Wickwere" of New London, now resident in Lyme," conveyed for 210;)C to Peter Wickwere his farm in the North Parish near Stonybrook.

The will of Joshua Baker, dated May 25, 1740, devises certain land partially described as follows:
"Beginning at Peter Wickwire's south corner of a certain piece of land which he bought of his brother Christopher, and so running a west line until it comes to Samson Haughton's northwest corner," etc.

The last will and testament of Christopher Wick ware, or Wickwere, as he spelled it, reads as follows:

"In the Name of God Amen.

I Christopher Wickwere of Lyme in the County of New London and Colony of Connecticut in New England, Husbandman, Do this twenty-sixth day of October in the year of our Lord God one Thousand Seven Hundred Forty and Six being sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory Thanks be given unto God, therefor, and calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to Dye, Do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament, That is to say Principally and first of all I Give and Recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in Decent Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting but at the Generall Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as Touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I Give, Devise and Dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

Imprimis, I give and bequeath unto my sons namely Ichabod, Solomon, Nathan, James and Zebediah all my horse kind, horn cattell, sheep, ploughs, plough Tackling, axes, houghs, Iron Crow bar and other utensils of Husbandry, Tools equally to be Divided between my said sons before mentioned share and share alike as also five shoats running about the place to be Disposed off as before mentioned, as also I give and bequeath unto my said sons all my Rights of Land that now or shall belong to me as also all my Debts belonging to me and also pay all my debts that I owe out of the above mentioned premises.

Item. I give, devise and bequeath unto my Daughters, namely Elizabeth the wife of Joshua Baker of New London, Ann Chapman widow, Mary the wife of Nathaniel Avery of said Lyme and Bridget, all my Household Goods to be equally Divided between them share and share alike after my said three last mentioned Daughters be made equall with what my said Daughter Elizabeth hath already had of me.

Item. I make and ordain my sole executors of this my last will and Testament my sons Solomon and Nathan Wickwere.

In witness I have hereunto set my hand and seal the Day and year first above written.

In 1710 when Christopher was 30, he married **Elizabeth Swaddle** in New London, CT. Born on 26 Apr 1690 in New London, CT. Elizabeth died in New London, CT, in 1745; she was 54.

4. Peter Wickwire (*John*¹). Born on 12 Mar 1694 in New London, CT. Peter died in New London, CT, on 21 Aug 1744; he was 50.

Second Generation. 5 PETER- (John¹), born March 12, 1694, at the North Parish of New London, Conn., now known as Montville. His name appears often upon the land and church records. On March 27, 1734, he conveyed to Jonathan Harris for 500 pounds certain lands adjoining those of Col. John Livingston, deceased; and on April 12, 1736, he conveyed to John Nobles 225 acres at New London, his wife Patience joining to release her dower rights. In 1736/7 he was chosen as a member of a committee to treat with the Indians. He and his wife united with the church at the North Parish under the pastorate of Rev. James Hillhouse, Nov. 21, 1722. Under date of Sept. 27, 1725, Hempstead's Diary says: "A town meeting to choose Leather Sealers. Lt. Chapman and Peter Wickwire chosen." On Mar. 31, 1733, 32 acres of land on Pole's Hill were laid out to him. On April 19, 1736, he was appointed a member of a committee to employ Rev. William Adams. On Mar. 7, 1736, he was a member of a committee to treat with the Indians regarding a meeting-house. In 1740 he was an attesting witness to the will of Joshua Baker.

He married Feb. 29, 1720-1, Patience Chapel, b. 1699, daughter of John and Sarah (Lewis) Chapel, and granddaughter of William and Christian Chapel, the ancestors of the Chapels of Montville. The banns were published Sept. 11, 1720. Hempstead's Diary, under date of Sunday, Dec. 1, 1734, records: "An infant of Peter Wickwire's buried between meetings." Under date of Feb. 6, 1742-3 the Diary says: "The widow Hannah Baker an aged woman about 88 died in the N. Parish at Peter Wickwire's (she was his

aunt)."

The will of Peter Wickware, dated August 10, 1744, proved Sept. 11, 1744, provides first that all his debts shall be paid. It bequeathes to Patience, his "dearly beloved wife," a sorrell mare, side saddle and bridle, two good milch cows, one feather bed and furniture, and one third of all his real estate "during her widowhood"; to Peter, his son, "all the money that the Hammond farm sells for," one mare, saddle and bridle, and teaming implements; to his daughter Sarah 100 pounds, one milch cow and a feather bed; to his daughter Amey, "when of age of 18 years," 100 pounds, one milch cow and a feather bed; to the rest of his sons, viz.:

George, Joseph, Jeremiah, Samuel, John and Ezekiel, all the rest of his estate to be equally divided among them "when they shall come of full age, and to be bound to some trade as soon as they come of the age of 14 years, at the discretion of my executors." His wife Patience and son Peter were named as executors. David Jewell, Benjamin Wheat, and Joshua Raymond were witnesses. The inventory was filed Oct. 4, 1744. Among the numerous articles listed were "one Beever hat," appraised at two pounds and 15 shillings; one pair of silver shoe buckles, appraised at two pounds; another pair of shoe buckles, appraised at one pound and 15 shillings; one great coat appraised at seven pounds; and one farm, appraised at 1600 pounds. On March 25, 1760, the executors filed an additional inventory. The total appraised value of the estate was 2634 pounds, 11 shillings, and six pence. On April 7, 1760, upon the petition of his son Peter, three freeholders Jason Allen, Stephen Hempstead and Joshua Raymond, Jr., were appointed to distribute the estate. On Aug. 30, 1765, a very long instrument was filed by these freeholders, apportioning the farm in separate tracts among the sons George, Samuel, Joseph, Jeremiah, Ezekiel and John. It gave to the widow Patience a portion of the farm; "also the great lower room in the dwelling house, and the chamber over it, and the westerly third part of the cellar under said room."

It showcases many elements of the Neo-Classical style with its symmetrical, simplistic appearance as well as its delicate window mouldings, pronounced corner pilasters, returning eaves with cornice and its pedimented front gable porch on Doric columns.

THE LATE JOHN LEANDER WICKWIRE, CANNING, N.S

JOHN LEANDER WICKWIRE, Canning, N.S., was born at that place, June nth, 1832. He was the eldest son of Peter and Eliza (Rockwell) Wickwire, and received his education in his native county.

At an early age, he engaged in speculating, which he carried on extensively, for many years, with much success. He was one of the most thorough and energetic men in the county, a man of sound judgment, and clear business foresight, and was always ready to aid in promoting public enterprises. In religion, Mr. Wickwire had been brought up a Baptist, and always favored that denomination, although he was not a member of any church.

In politics, he was an active Liberal, being a prominent and influential member of that party. He was married in November, 1866, to Annie Alice, daughter of the late well-known ship owner, James Lawton, of St. John, N.B. His family consisted of two sons and two daughters. Mr. Wickwire died very suddenly on May 19th, 1891, deeply regretted by all who knew him. He was widely known in his section, for his

The son of a World War I Canadian Army general, he received his education at various schools, including Bishop's College School in Lennoxville, Quebec, the Royal Military College of Canada, Kingston, Ontario, McGill University, Montreal, Quebec, and King's College at Windsor, Nova Scotia as a cadet. In July 1924 he withdrew from the Royal Military College to receive the King's commission and a posting to the Permanent Force with Lord Strathcona's Horse, an armored regiment of the Canadian Army. By 1934 he held the rank of captain. He attended the Staff College, Camberley, Surrey, England from 1937 until 1939 and was promoted to major and posted as brigade major of 1st Canadian Infantry Brigade at the outbreak of World War II. In 1941 he was promoted to the rank of lieutenant colonel and became commander of the newly activated 4th Reconnaissance Battalion (4th Princess Louise Dragoon Guards), assigned to 1st Canadian Infantry Division in England. In 1942, he was appointed commanding officer of the 1st Battalion, The Highland Light Infantry of Canada. In 1943 he led Canadian troops in the Kiska campaign on the Aleutian Islands of Alaska (Operation Cottage), for which he was awarded the American Legion of Merit. Unknown to the Allies, the Japanese had withdrawn three weeks before the attack. In 1944 he was promoted to the rank of major general and assumed command of the 4th Canadian (Armored) Division in Normandy, where he participated in the D-Day landing (June 6) on Juno Beach. On September 12, 1944, his forces entered the historic city of Bruges, Belgium and the liberation of this medieval town was done successfully, without fight or damage. He later traded commands with Canadian Major General Chris Vokes and led the 1st Canadian Infantry Division in Italy, then returned with this division to North-West Europe as part of Operation Goldflake. After the war, he presided over the court martial of Canada's top prisoner of war, German SS General Kurt Meyer. The trial was a showcase for Canada, the first time that the country had conducted an international prosecution of this sort. In 1946 he organized and commanded Eastern Army Command from 1946 and upon retirement in 1952 he took the civilian appointment of chief administrator of the Central European District, Imperial War Graves Commission. Frederick B. (Ted) Wickwire was educated in Halifax, received his Bachelor of Commerce degree in 1959 and his Bachelor of Laws degree in 1962 from Dalhousie University, and practiced in the field of corporate and commercial law with a special interest in property rights. He was appointed Queen's Counsel in 1978. His service to Dalhousie University involved 13 years as a member of the Board of Governors.

A senior partner in the firm of MacInnes Wilson Flinn Wickwire, in 1977 he was appointed the first chairman of the Nova Scotia Legal Aid Commission. He worked tirelessly to ensure that Nova Scotia barristers maintained a level of uncompromised professionalism. To this end he served as chairman of the Nova Scotia Barristers' Society's Legal Ethics Committee and oversaw the creation of a new handbook on ethics and professional conduct for Nova Scotia lawyers. His service to the legal profession culminated in his election as president of the Barristers' Society in June 1990, a position he held at the time of his death on March 22, 1991.

For his work with both the Nova Scotia Barristers' Society and the development of Legal Aid in Nova Scotia, he posthumously won the Weldon Award for Unselfish Public Service from the Dalhousie Law School Alumni Association in October 1991.

Frederick B. (Ted) Wickwire QC, a graduate of the School, was the President of the Nova Scotia Barristers' Society. He died in office at the age of 52 in 1991. Ted Wickwire was noted for his commitment to public service and to uncompromising professionalism. Each year, a lecture is held in his memory, focusing on an aspect of professional ethics.

If the field and court could talk...oh, the stories they would tell.

They would talk of the football and basketball legend, Ted Wickwire.

Frederick B. "Ted" Wickwire began his university career at Dalhousie in 1956.

That autumn, Ted suited up for his first football game as a starting cornerback.

During that game the quarterback suffered a serious injury. The result was bittersweet as rookie Ted assumed the quarterback position and did not relinquish his post through six seasons of varsity football.

During his rookie year (1956-57), the football Tigers did not win a game. Yet, the stands were full of cheering fans out to catch a glimpse of the perseverance and determination of the young team. Ted's individual efforts were recognized by the Nova Scotia Canadian Football League as he was runner-up for Most Valuable Rookie honours.

It wasn't until October 5, 1957 when the team's hard work paid off. Dalhousie recorded a 39-6 victory over the Greenwood Bombers, breaking a 10-game, two-year losing streak. Ted and company never looked back. Ted was the passing and running star, alongside friend and fellow inductee, runningback great, Peter Corkum. The team became a force to be reckoned with and finished second to eventual league champs, the Shearwater Flyers.

The following year (1958-59), Ted, scored one touchdown and passed for another in a game against Stadacona. That effort propelled the team into the league semifinals. Dalhousie finished the season after being edged into a semifinal loss again at the hands of the Shearwater Flyers. The two-game total point series was a heartbreaking 28-20 deficit for the Tigers.

The team continued to improve into the 1959-60 season, the senior year of Ted's undergraduate program. Again, Dalhousie faced Stadacona, this time in the league semifinal. The Tigers were victorious and advanced to the league's championship game. Unfortunately, they fell victim to StFX, a team that would

be the eventual national champions; a first for the Atlantic conference.

Ted's exceptional play and leadership during the 1959-60 season resulted in the conference's highest honour. He was awarded the Duffus Trophy as the Atlantic Football Conference (AFC)'s most valuable player. Also, Ted was runner-up for this award the following year.

Ted's final season (1961-62) saw Dalhousie continue to be a leading force in the AFC. In the final game of his career, he went 15-31 for 142 yards and ran four times for 56 yards. Despite a third place league finish, Dalhousie's superstar Ted was outstanding.

Ted's university football career included rushing for 1100 yards and leading the conference by passing for over 4000 yards. He scored 42 points in league competition. Twice, Ted won the Little Trophy awarded to Dalhousie's most valuable football player (1960-61, 1961-62). He also took home the Climo Award (1959-60), the highest athletic award that can be bestowed on a male Dalhousie student. The award is presented annually to the male who best displays outstanding athletic ability, sportsmanship and team spirit. Ted is remembered as one of the greatest quarterbacks to ever play in Maritime football.

The University honoured Ted and Peter, the living legends, at a ceremony following their last game of varsity football at Dalhousie. It was officially declared that November 11, 1961 was "Corkum and Wickwire Day," marking the end of an era of football at Dalhousie.

On the court, Ted wore the black and gold for four varsity basketball seasons. In his rookie year (1956-57), Ted scored 28 points against Acadia only to out-do his own record the following year (1957-58) by scoring an unprecedented 42 points in a single playoff match against Saint Mary's, putting Dalhousie in the conference championship final. He managed to accomplish these individual feats while being recognized as a superb team player, always willing to pass the ball. Ted had a quiet modesty over his individual achievements. He was more eager to talk about Dalhousie's 1959 basketball upset of StFX. The 56-55 score broke a five-year losing streak against the X-Men.

Other Dalhousie awards bestowed on Ted include a Silver "D" award for his rookie efforts in football and basketball in 1956-57 followed by a Gold "D" in 1958-59. Ted was also honoured with a First Engraving "D" in 1960-61. The monogrammed placards were presented for years of outstanding contribution to Dalhousie athletics.

Ted graduated from Dalhousie in 1959 with a Bachelor of Commerce degree. He was later admitted to the bar after receiving a Bachelor of Law degree in 1962.

Ted has served his community and his alma mater well. He was involved with numerous athletic organizations and councils at Dalhousie including three years as Chairman of the Advisory Council on Athletics and 13 years on the University's Board of Governors. He also volunteered his time and shared his expertise with many professional associations related to his profession. In 1978, Ted was appointed the prestigious honour of Queen's Council. In 1990, Ted was elected president of the Barrister's Society and, in 1991, he was presented the Weldon Law Award for unselfish public service.

In 1993, by unanimous vote, the University's Board of Governors renamed Studley Field, Wickwire Memorial Field, as it is known today. A commemorative plaque dedicated to Ted greets players, coaches and visitors upon entry to Wickwire Field.
